
To Our Supporters and Partners,

As the only Title II (state-funded) agency in Delaware County, DCLC is a vital component of the resources available to residents who want to improve their education and employment opportunities. During the 2023-2024 program year, DCLC experienced the most growth and innovation since the pandemic, including serving 27% more people than the previous year (774 adults) and increasing the average instructional hours 30% above the standard (95 hours per student). Based on this demonstrated program strength, we received an additional \$416k in state funding. As a result of this funding increase, DCLC was able to hire additional instructors and student support staff, increasing the capacity for providing the direct services our participants need.

While support from the Department of Education is crucial, none of the work we do would be possible without you, our wonderful community of supporters – volunteers, community partners, and donors. Keep an eye out for what's ahead for us, including celebrating 50 years of providing adult education services with a birthday bash at Harrah's Casino on April 24th, rolling out our special 50th anniversary logo (below), and increasing brand awareness by transitioning from DCLC to Delco Literacy. We're dedicated to honoring our history while we welcome the future and evolve to meet the needs of those who need us most, and we thank you for your continued support as we move ahead together.

Delco Literacy's Workforce Development Program combines individualized career coaching, essential skills training, and support services to help adult learners overcome barriers to employment success. Participants receive personalized support including weekly coaching sessions, professional skills development, and assistance with resume writing and interview preparation.

Andrés Mauricio Zapata is a chemist who wanted to apply for a job with a government agency. He met weekly with Delco Literacy Career Advisor Elaine Herbert who helped him revise his resume from four pages to two, coached him through mock interview sessions to prepare him for future interviews, and offered suggestions of other companies and resources that would assist him in his job search.

Zapata took the initiative to prepare a PowerPoint presentation representing his skills and knowledge which impressed the interviewers. He received a job offer, and most recently contacted Elaine to inform her of his recent promotion.

"I got a promotion, and I am happy because we are looking for a house," said Zapata. "Thanks for everything, Elaine. Your help was very important in this process."


